BACKGROUND

As the regional Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization (MPO), the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) is required to prepare a RTP/SCS every four years for the counties of Imperial, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino and Ventura. The Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) component of the plan is a long-range transportation plan that reflects a region-specific, balanced, multimodal plan that serves as a guide for public policy and investment decisions throughout the region. Using growth forecasts and economic trends that project out to 2040, the RTP considers the role of transportation in the broader context of economic, environmental, and quality-of-life goals for the future, and identifying regional transportation strategies to address our mobility needs. Beginning in 2008, SB 375 (Steinberg) required the inclusion of the SCS in the RTP development. SCS is intended to integrate land use and transportation strategies that will achieve greenhouse gas emissions reduction targets.

SCAG is in the process of preparing the 2016-2040 RTP/SCS. The 2016 RTP/SCS includes over 2,000 transportation projects—ranging from freeway improvements, railroad grade separations, bicycle lanes, new transit hubs and replacement bridges. The RTP/SCS development and adoption process is shown in the table below.

NEXT STEPS

SCAG has undertaken an extensive outreach program to disseminate information and receive feedback on the 2016 RTP/SCS. Hasan Ikhrata, Executive Director of SCAG, presented an overview at the October Governing Board meeting. Naresh Amatya, Director of Transportation Planning, and Huasha Liu, Director of Land Use and Environmental Planning, will be presenting at the January Planning TAC meeting.

Both the draft plan and the Program Environmental Impact Report entered into a 60-day public review and comment period, beginning Dec. 4, 2015 and ending February 1, 2016 at 5:00 PM.
